

## STEAM TRAMS:

- 1-2 built by V. Purrey, Bordeaux, France, 1909  
single truck steam tram motor with Purrey bodies. Front engine with seating.  
Rebuilt: 1923 = 2 and converted to compound.  
1924 = 1  
Withdrawn: 1939 = 1 & 2  
Disposal: 2 to farmer at Baralaba, 7/41
- 3-4 built by V. Purrey, Bordeaux, France, 1910  
single truck steam tram motor with R.C.C. bodies. Front engine with passenger accommodation.  
Rebuilt: 1920 = 4 (Offisde enclosed about 1930)  
1922 = 3  
Withdrawn: 1939 = 3 & 4  
Disposals: 3 & 4 to Scouts Association for use as accommodation at Seonee Pk on the Yeppoon Road. 3 still visible in 1971.
- 5-6 built by V. Purrey, Bordeaux, France, 1911  
single truck steam tram motor with local bodies. Fitted with passenger area.  
Rebuilt: 1920 = 6 (last tram in service)  
1923 = 5 (Offisde enclosed in 1934)  
Withdrawn: 1939 = 5 & 6  
Disposals not known
- 7-8 Imported tandem compound tram motors. (possibly built by Purrey), 1912  
single truck steam tram motor with local bodies.  
Rebuilt: 1921 = 7 & 8 (both enclosed about 1934 on the offside)  
Withdrawn: 1939 but disposals not known.
- 15 (9) Imported 4-cylinder Simple tram motor.  
body built by Burns & Twigg, Rockhampton, 1922. Fitted with 2 entrances and erected at the depot.  
Rebuilt: 1924 and converted to Toastrack, with offside enclosed.  
Renumbered: 15 to 9 in 1933  
Withdrawal: 1939. Disposal not known.

## Trailers

- 9-10 built by Brown Engineering (London), UK, 1909  
single truck 40 passenger trailer with toastrack seating.  
Withdrawn: 1939 = 9-10  
Renumbered: 9 to 15 in 1933  
Disposal: 10 to Scouts Association for accommodation at Seonee Pk, 8/40.
- 11 built in R.C.C. Workshops, 1911  
single truck 40 passenger toastrack trailer. Open sides with simple roof.  
Withdrawn: 1939 = 11
- 12 built in R.C.C. Workshops, 1921  
single truck 40 passenger toastrack trailer. Completely open. Body rebuilt 1929.  
Withdrawn: 1939 = 12
- 13-14 built in R.C.C. Workshops, 1922  
single truck 48 passenger toastrack trailer. Open sides with simple roof.  
Withdrawn: 1939 = 13-14

Trams had the words "Rockhampton Council Tramways" on the sides until early 1930's.  
Changed to Rockhampton City Tramways.
